


Be Still: Dwelling Undistracted in His Presence

OUR EMPATHETIC SAVIOR

Let's look at the very familiar story of Mary, Jesus, and Lazarus in John 11:17-35.

When Jesus arrived, He found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, some two miles away, and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met Him, while Mary stayed at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that God will give you whatever you ask of Him." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to Him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world."

When she had said this, she went back and called her sister Mary, and told her privately, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you." And when she heard it, she got up quickly and went to Him. Now Jesus had not yet come to the village but was still at the place where Martha had met Him. The Jews who were with her in the house, consoling her, saw Mary get up quickly and go out. They followed her because they thought that she was going to the tomb to weep there. When Mary came where Jesus was and saw Him, she knelt at his feet and said to Him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, He was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to Him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus began to weep.

Jesus knelt beside Mary, weeping with her over the death of her brother, even though Jesus knew He would soon resurrect Lazarus. This poignant moment is a powerful testament to the depth of Jesus's sorrow and His extraordinary capacity to empathize with our grief. It is essential to recognize that Jesus does not distance Himself from the human experience of suffering; instead, He immerses Himself in it, choosing to share in the pain and heartbreak we encounter in moments of loss and despair. By kneeling beside Mary, He honored her feelings and validated the weight of her sorrow, demonstrating that grief is a natural and significant part of the human experience.

Let's consider this for a moment. The depth of Mary's grief profoundly moved Jesus. Her overwhelming sorrow triggered a heartfelt response from Him, revealing that His compassion is not just a distant acknowledgment but an active participation in our suffering. This act of weeping illustrates that Jesus experiences profound empathy for us when we are in distress. His compassion transcends the boundaries of passive observation; it involves a deep and personal engagement with the pain and challenges we endure, whether they stem from physical illnesses, emotional struggles, mental anguish, hope deferred, loss, or spiritual despair. In our darkest moments, He stands with us, sharing our burdens and offering solace and understanding. This deep connection reassures us that we are not alone in our trials but instead accompanied by a Savior who fully comprehends the weight of our struggles and the intensity of our heartache.

When we pass through the valley of death and despair knocks at our door, Jesus is there with us, weeping! We are never alone in our sorrow. He is always by our side, the greatest friend we could ever have, and He never lets us down—not even once!

from Finding Beautiful


One-Minute Solitude Meditation

Find a comfortable position. Relax your eyes. Inhale deeply and exhale slowly. For one minute, remain in solitude, contemplating the Goodness of the Father.

Visio Divina - Lord, we open our eyes to see what you see.



Meditation - Lord, we explore and meditate on Your truth.
